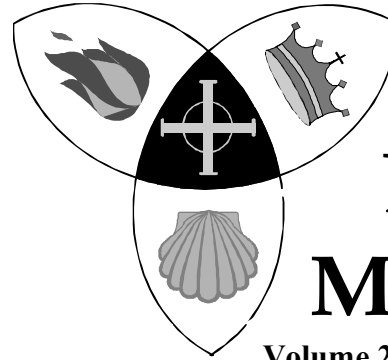

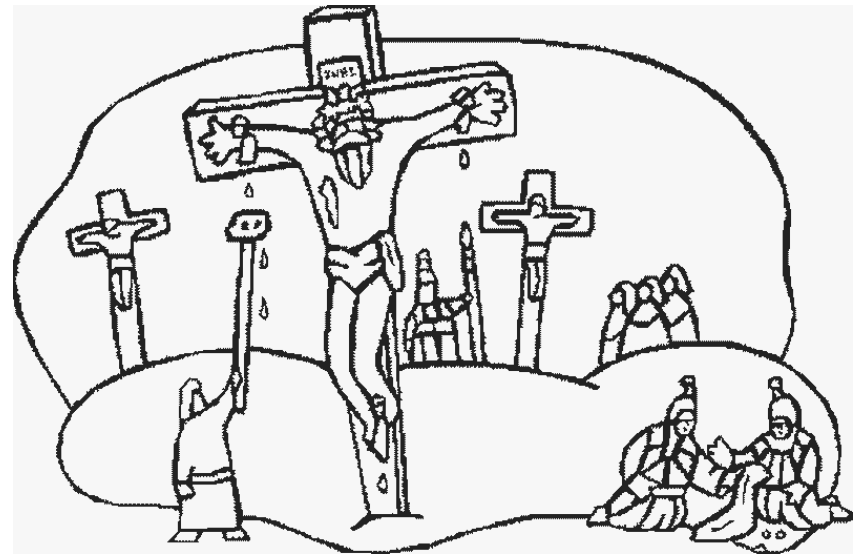

Dear Friends of the Crucified and Risen Messiah,

THE DISCIPLE THOMAS was deeply wounded by the death of Jesus. He refused to be comforted by the unbelievable stories of other disciples. Only if he saw and touched the wounds of the risen Jesus would he believe. That is exactly what happened: Jesus came to Thomas and invited him to touch the wounds and believe.

THE RISEN JESUS still shows disciples His wounds. In those wounds we see...

- +How deeply our Lord suffered because of our sin.
- +How great His love is for us.
- +How well Jesus knows the suffering we experience in this life.
- +How our wounds may be tools the Lord uses to bring others to new life in Him.

JESUS IS THE WOUNDED HEALER. He does not save us from the pains of life. But He has gone through them ahead of us. Jesus took the worst this world could do to Him and turned it into God's greatest gift for us—New life now and eternal life with Him and all God's children.

DEATH CHANGES THE LIVING. When someone dear to us dies, we are deeply wounded. Our lives are changed forever. Eventually that wound may heal, but even when fully healed a severe wound leaves a scar.

YET, REGARDLESS OF OUR WOUNDS, our Lord has a future prepared for disciples like Thomas and us. God may even use our suffering to bring healing and new life to others. Come to hear the story and receive the new life only available through our crucified and risen Lord.

## ***Incarnation Information – April 2009***

The pace is starting to pick up as we move into spring. Instead of occasional gatherings, the Incarnation leadership team is now meeting (nearly) every week to pray, grow together as a group, strategize and plan. Over the next months we will be doing more specific planning for finances, worship, advertising, and securing and preparing worship space with the hope of doing our first worship in July. We will be keeping an eye on how fast things proceed so we know if we need to delay our start. It is vitally important to have enough people when we start worship to have a critical mass. It is better to start later and stronger rather than earlier and weaker.

We are specifically inviting people from Messiah and St. Mark's to commit to worshipping with us for a while. You may be able to worship at both Messiah and Incarnation the same morning depending on Incarnation's worship time! If you feel called to help with providing initial energy and momentum for Incarnation, please talk to Pastor Mark or come to a meeting. We will also be inviting people with specific talents and knowledge to be advisors. For example, if you have done sound or music for worship, we may be inviting you to help us make sure we are getting off to a good start in that area.

Pastor Mark will be setting goals for knocking on doors over the next months. The goal he is considering is "4000 Doors by July 4." Come and join him. The main goal of initial calls is not doing a "hard sell" to convince people to come to the church. It is mostly to increase awareness that there will be a new church. We will also be planning interest meetings and visibility events so more people become aware of Incarnation and have a chance to get connected.

We seek your prayers and your words of invitation to friends and family who may be interested in Incarnation. Information will be included on the website (Incarnation-elca.org) and in Messiah bulletins and newsletters, but you can get more regular updates by having Pastor Mark add you to the email update list or the weekly email devotion mailing list. Feel free to arrange a meeting with Pastor Mark if you want to learn more.

### **The Alpha Course Starting Wednesday, April 15**

For six Wednesdays from April 15 to May 20 you will have the opportunity to invest in growing your faith and your knowledge of the basics of Christianity. Alpha is a course that has been attended by millions of people around the world. Its benefit for those who have attended include life-long Christians having their faith revitalized, and people who have questions or are new to Christianity developing a strong base upon which their faith can grow. Pastor Mark has been transformed himself and had many members from his congregations in Minneapolis and Harrisburg say it was a life-changing thing for them. Some of the largest congregations in the ELCA use Alpha as the main outreach and entryway into the life of their congregation.

A typical evening will begin with eating at the Wednesday Night Café. After that (about 6:15) will be a prayer and a song. Then there will be a video to introduce the topic followed by an opportunity to discuss the content of the video in small groups and as a large group. We will be done about 7:30 each week. The thing that is unique about Alpha is that it is based on the basic questions of faith. Each week covers a different question (such as -Why did Jesus die? How can I be sure of my faith? Who is the Holy Spirit?)

There is no cost unless you want to order a manual (about \$4) or the book that has a chapter for each of the weekly topics. It is best to come every week, but if you can't do that, come when you can.

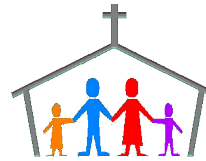
