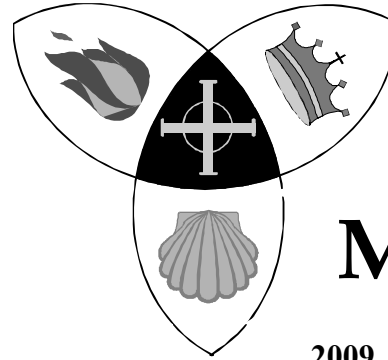

*Pastor Mark's Remarks for September 2009**"Next Departure: 10:45 AM on Sunday, September 13"*

Then Jesus said to his disciples, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it. For what will it profit them if they gain the whole world but forfeit their life?" Matthew 16:24-26

I like Messiah. I like the people of Messiah. I like the programs of Messiah. I like Pastor Scott. I like the fantastic church staff. I like the health of Messiah. I like the stability of Messiah. I don't like taking risks. So why do I need to take the next step of moving away from Messiah toward Incarnation and the Harvest community? Jesus didn't call me to safety. He called me to life. Seeking to save my life and play it safe would actually cause me to lose some of who God has called me to be. Maybe it's just a mid-life crisis causing me to want adventure, but I have a sense it is more than that. The church is not meant to help people hold on to their lives, but rather to help them let go of their lives to follow Jesus.

I have the sense that many people are looking for more than just a safe place to go and be fed spiritually every week and then doing the same the next week and the next week and the next week. One thing I hope can be part of the basic identity of Incarnation is inviting people to a life that might not always be safe and predictable, but will be significant and make a difference in the world.

Not that Harvest is a dangerous wilderness where the pioneers of Incarnation are in danger of freezing or starving to death, but there is a sense that the classified ad placed 100 years ago in a London newspaper by South Pole explorer Ernest Shackleton connects with the invitation of Jesus to discover life and meaning by taking the risk of following him.

Men wanted for hazardous journey, small wages, bitter cold, long months of complete darkness, constant danger, safe return doubtful. Honor and recognition in case of success. Ernest Shackleton

Thanks for your support and prayers. I will not disappear from Messiah, but I will not be nearly as visible as I have been. One thing I hope to do, though, is keep on inviting people to take risks for the sake of the good news of Jesus. Maybe for you it is to take risks here at Messiah. Maybe it is taking risks in your family or work. Maybe for you it is to board a ship car for Harvest and join us for the short-term or long-term as an adventurer.

People wanted for hazardous journey, no wages, no fancy sanctuary or programs, no polished music program, no fine-tuned church council, no endowment fund, returning unchanged doubtful. Discovering real life and meaning the only reward.

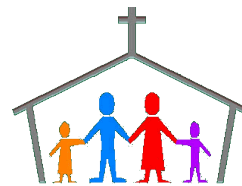
